Foreword

Christmas blessings to you as we sing, yet again, the story of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem! This 20-minute, sermon-length musical was created to share the good news AND be flexible to accommodate ensembles of varying age, size and ability. It was also designed to be attainable within the limited rehearsal time of the holiday season. Songs feature vocal solos followed by choral refrains, a nod to classical oratorio.

The vocal parts are scored for unison choir with optional harmony parts, and recurring themes appear throughout the score. The angel encounters with Mary, Joseph, and the Shepherds incorporate the same melodic ideas. In other words, even though there are nine musical selections in this score, choirs only need to learn five melodic ideas. This will build confidence with younger singers and maximize rehearsal time.

Journey to Bethlehem has many accompaniment options. The piano part has been crafted to work equally well either as solo accompaniment or as part of a chamber ensemble. A reproducible instrumental folio is available with parts for a small chamber orchestra. With the exception of the three-octave tonebells, which are beginner-level, the instrumental parts are intended for adult players. Any combination (or all) of these instrumental parts can be played in addition to the piano accompaniment to create a warm, orchestral sound. Accompaniment tracks with the full orchestration are also available.

ELIZABETH enters (opposite MARY). MARY crosses to her when the NARRATOR begins. ELIZABETH welcomes MARY with a hug.

NARRATOR: After some time, Mary went to visit her family in Judah. When she arrived, her cousin, Elizabeth, was stunned! The baby within Elizabeth leapt for joy!
